# Information for Entries to the 2010 Folk Art Competition and Exhibition

Any Sons of Norway member of District Two is eligible to enter the Folk Art Competition and Folk Art Exhibition to be held during the District Convention.

# There are 12 categories of entry:

1. Rosemaling	7. <b>Figure carving</b> (With hand tools - Norwegian motif)
2. Weaving (Norwegian design)	8. <b>Relief carving</b> (With hand tools - Norwegian motif)
3. Hardanger embroidery	9. Chip carving (With hand tools)
4. <b>Needlework</b> (e.g., Klostersom & Diamantsom and other	10. Bentwood
traditional needlework with a Norwegian theme)	11. Other hand crafts (Norwegian motif)
5. <b>Hand knitting</b> (Norwegian theme)	12. <b>Other media</b> , including photography, with a Norwegian
6. Crocheting and tatting	theme or motif.

# There are four classes for each category of exhibition and/or competition.

- 1. Children (Children and grandchildren of District Two members, 15 years old and under, are eligible for exhibition only.)
- 2. **Youth**, ages 16-20
- 3. Adult Amateurs (persons who engage in a given activity as a pastime)
- 4. Adult Professionals (including teachers of the crafts and persons who engage in the activity for gainful reasons, i.e., sales).
- All items submitted must have been made by the entrant and must have been finished within the past two years.
- An entrant is allowed to enter a maximum of two articles in each category.
- All items must be delivered to the Convention Folk Art Committee by the opening of the Convention. Since the entrants may not be attending the convention, the most practical approach may be to have the delegates from the lodges bring the entries of fellow lodge artists to the convention along with a waiver signed by the entrant. If a waiver is not signed, the item will not be accepted.

Each category will have first, second, and third place ribbons awarded. A "Best of Show" ribbon/rosette will also be awarded. The viewing public will be invited to vote for their favorite and a" People's Choice" ribbon/rosette will be awarded. All participants will receive a certificate of participation.

Each year, on May 17, Norwegians fill their streets with cheers and flags in celebration of Norway's constitution, adopted in 1814. Many people wear the national dress, the bunad, on this occasion. The bunad varies in appearance from region to region and the magnificent sight of national costumes from all over the country is one of the reasons why this day truly represents a celebration of Norwegian tradition and history.

As a lodge we celebrate the culture and heritage of Norway. On Monday, May 17, we will be a part of the Syttende Mai Parade in Ballard. The parade begins at 6:00 in the evening. For us it will be a dual celebration. Our float will be decorated with a cake celebrating the 100<sup>th</sup> birthday of District 2 of which we are a part. # MOLASSES FRUIT COOKIES

There have been many requests for this recipe used at Heritage Day.

3/4 cup shortening
1 1/4 cups sugar
2 eggs
3 1/4 cups flour
2 tsp baking powder
2 tsp soda
1/2 tsp each of the following:
cinnamon, cloves, mace and salt
1/2 cup light molasses

1 cup raisins

Cream together shortening and sugar
Add eggs one at a time ---beat until well mixed
Mix flour and spices together --add to above mixture alternately with the molasses

Divide batter into 4 logs the length of your cookie sheet. Place 2 logs per cookie sheet and bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes. A small amount of moisture should be visible on top of cookie when done.

Cool and then drizzle powder sugar frosting on top

(1 cup powder sugar & 4 - 5 tbsp milk - pinch salt - 1/2 tsp vanilla)

Cut cookies into 1 1/2 inch strips at an angle.

# **NORWAY'S DOOMSDAY VAULT**

Oslo, Norway

2010

Two years ago in the Norwegian archipelago, known as Svalbard, the Svalbard Global Seed Vault was opened. It has now amassed half a million seed samples and houses at least one-third of the world's crop seeds according to Cary Fowler who heads the trust that oversees the collection.

The Svalbard Vault is in a remote location 620 miles from the North Pole and is designed to withstand global warming, earthquakes, and nuclear strikes. The vault is a safeguard against the loss of seeds should a global disaster, whether natural or manmade, wipe out the world's crops. It is the only known vault of its kind.

# Celebrate 100 years of District 2 Sons of Norway!

Why Fram, forward into the future? Fram means forward in English! The Sons of Norway continues to move forward into the future by developing programs to honor our ancestry and interest in historical and modern Norway.

2010 is the centennial of the consolidation and merger on 9 July 1910 in Grand Forks, North Dakota, of the Grand Lodge of the Sons of Norway of the Pacific Coast organized on 13 May 1903 with Sons of Norway organized on 16 January 1895 in the Midwest to become Sons of Norway with two districts. This logo commemorates the formation of District 2 which had lodges in Washington, California, Oregon, Idaho, and British Columbia. From 1913-1924 lodges in Montana were part of District 2. In 1952, the California lodges were transferred into the new District 6. Then in 1966, British Columbia lodges were transferred into District 7. We now have lodges in Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, and Washington with over 11,000 members.

Pacific Northwest forests provided the masts for the Norwegian ice ship, *Fram*. "She has voyaged further both north and south than any other surface vessel in history." August 2010 marks the 100th anniversary of the beginning of her historic voyage to the South Pole with Roald Amundsen and his crew.
