I was looking at the calendar recently, primarily to count down the days until Spring Break, when I noticed that Easter falls on March 31st this year. Why is Easter so early? Easter always falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon in Spring.

I loved Easter as a girl. My sisters and I decorated hard boiled eggs, and my mom hid them out in the yard. The next morning, we would take our baskets and run around the yard looking for the hidden eggs, sometime in the snow! Mom hid those eggs well because I remember one year, I found an Easter egg in June under a rock!

Easter growing up was a one-day celebration on Easter Sunday but in Norway Easter is a five-day celebration. Banks are closed for three days and people take a week or two off work to go skiing or enjoy the outdoors soaking in the early spring sun. One unique Norwegian tradition is reading, watching or listening to påskekrim (Easter Crime). This tradition started back in the 1920's when two Norwegian authors wrote a crime novel about student skiers, a cabin and a crime that happened during the Easter Holidays. To this day crime novels and Easter go hand in hand in Norway.

Springtime at the lodge is a busy time. On March 2nd, Bothell lodge is hosting our annual Heritage Day. It is a day to celebrate our collective love of Norwegian traditions. A variety of demonstrations and activities are available for the public to explore, and a delicious lunch will be available for purchase. Indoor seating is available. There will also be a bake sale and the Viking village will be set up outside in the front for you to explore. Our lodge meeting this month is March 21. It's Corn Beef and Cabbage night. Yum! Our program will be the annual Uff Da awards.

Movie Corner

The Video for this month is in honor of those proud "Greatest Generation" members of the WWII US Army 99th Infantry Battalion.

Join us on **March 21 at 4:00PM**, as we watch this video. The US Army **99th Infantry Battalion** consisted of [Norwegian-speaking](#) soldiers. Created in July 1942 at [Camp Ripley](#), Minnesota, the battalion originally consisted of 1,001 soldiers. The battalion was attached to the First Army.

After the [attack on Pearl Harbor](#), the US [War Department](#) considered how the military could use foreigners and bilingual, first-generation immigrants from German-occupied areas to assist the war effort. The War Department set up special units of US citizens from certain ethnic groups (e.g., Norwegian, Greek, Filipino, Japanese) for operations in countries occupied by the [Axis powers](#). This video is the story of the Norwegian Battalion.

This battalion participated in the following campaigns, actions:

- Normandy: June 22, 1944 – July 24, 1944
- Northern France: June 25, 1944 – Sept 14, 1944
- Rhineland (Würzlen–Aachen): Sept 15, 1944 – Dec 16, 1944
- Ardennes–Alsace: Dec 17, 1944 – Jan 18, 1945 (Battle of the Bulge)
- Central Europe: Apr 4, 1945 – May 11, 1945
- Post-Victory in Europe Liberation of Norway

I would like to thank Chris Hicks for doing the Trustee duties for the month of February 2024.

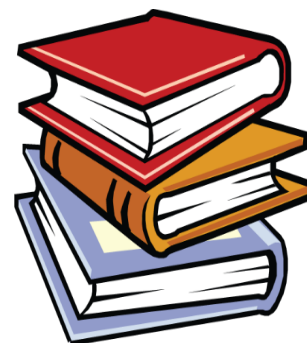

If you are interested in learning more about what we do and how we operate, please reach out to us. We would love to have more eager people learn about the everyday life of the Norse people in the Viking Age. We are always looking for more to join our ranks.

We are available throughout the year for live demonstrations and presentations for all types of groups and ages. Contact us for more info.

Here are some of the areas we provide living history and reenactment.

Warrior: a person who learns about and demonstrates proper and safe live steel combat

Cook: a person who learns about and demonstrates the proper cooking techniques as well as typical food of the time

Seer: a person who learns about and demonstrates reading and writing runes

Fiber Arts: a person who learns about and demonstrates the proper way to use wool, linen, etc.

Craftsmen: a person who learns about and demonstrates wood working, metal working, leatherworking, or other handcrafts

Skald: a person who learns about and demonstrates reading and writing poetry and/or singing and playing period instruments, reciting myths, and writing verse

You do not need to strictly focus on one aspect. Most of us are knowledgeable in multiple areas and practice multiple aspects. There are other areas of focus that can be explored. If you are interested, please let me know and I would be more than happy to help you.

Financial Corner

Interest rates remain elevated, and despite persistent inflation, bank interest earnings are disappointingly low. Does this sound familiar?
